The Mills County Board of Supervisors met this 16th day of September, 2014, in the meeting room at the Mills County Courthouse in Glenwood with Lonnie Mayberry, Richard Crouch and Ron Kohn present.

Motion by Crouch, seconded by Kohn to approve the September 16, 2014 agenda and the September 9th and 10th, 2014 minutes as corrected.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 3 Nays: 0

There were no utility permits to report this week.

Engineer Kevin Mayberry informed the Board of Supervisors that have an on-site visit for consideration of a driveway variance on next week's agenda. Mayberry reported that he will then leave the meeting to attend Flood Plain Manager's Training in Atlantic, Iowa.

Motion by Crouch seconded by Kohn to approve the hire of 2 temporary dispatchers who are both trained and familiar with the Mills County radio system. Kellie Jones and Amber Jennings will begin September 15, 2014 at a rate of \$17.64 per hour, which does not include IPERS or any other County benefits.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 3 Nays: 0

Patrick Binns, IT Director and County Attorney Tricia McSorley were present to discuss the purchase of two tablets for the County Attorney's office.

Motion by Kohn seconded by Crouch to approve the purchase of two tablets from CDW at \$896.51 each which includes cases and keyboard covers for a total cost of \$1793.02.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 3 Nays: 0

All information has not been received for the Board to sign the corrected Stanek Deed Agreement. McSorley requested this be tabled until next week's meeting.

Motion by Kohn seconded by Crouch to allow Kiwanis to use the courtyard during the Glenwood Homecoming Parade to make funnel cakes.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 3 Nays: 0

Sheriff Gene Goos, County Attorney Tricia McSorley and Interim E911 Director Larry Hurst were present for discussion with the Board of Supervisors regarding security in all County buildings. Hurst presented a draft active shooter policy for the Board to examine that will be used to train County employees.

Discussion was also held about placing a metal detector near the Courtroom doors. Sheriff Goos explained that a deputy would need to be placed on duty there at all times if a metal detector was installed. This will be discussed again at a later date.

Motion by Crouch seconded by Kohn to authorize the Chair to sign the 28E Agreement with Fremont County for substance abuse and case management services.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 3 Nays: 0

The Mills County Board of Supervisors met as a Board of Canvass to canvass the East Mills Election that was held on September 9, 2014. The vote was as follows:

Motion by Crouch seconded by Kohn to approve the canvass of votes as presented.
