The Mills County Board of Supervisors met this 23rd day of February, 2015, in the meeting room at the Mills County Courthouse in Glenwood with Lonnie Mayberry and Richard Crouch present. Supervisor Kohn was absent.

Motion by Mayberry seconded by Crouch to approve the agenda of February 23, 2015 and the minutes of February 17, 2015 as presented.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 2 Nays: 0

There was one utility permit to report this week:

MidAmerican Energy - installing underground electrical north of Alcorn Avenue along Bunge Avenue.

Signage off of County roads into local city jurisdictions was discussed.

Motion by Mayberry seconded by Crouch to approve a liquor License with outdoor service privileges beginning April 1, 2015 through July 31, 2015 for Back Room.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 2 Nays: 0

Motion by Mayberry seconded by Crouch to approve the Class C liquor license renewal for Fountains Ballroom which includes Class B wine permit, outdoor service and Sunday sales.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 2 Nays: 0

Motion by Mayberry seconded by Crouch to sign and approve Resolution 15-06 – Civil Service Commission.

RESOLUTION 15-06

WHEREAS Pottawattamie County, Iowa has established a Civil Service Commission within Pottawattamie County as provided for Iowa Code Chapter 341A.

WHEREAS Iowa Code Chapter 341A allows counties to establish a combined civil service commission to serve multiple counties.

WHEREAS Mills County, Iowa is currently working to re-establish its Civil Service Commission and has requested that the Pottawattamie County Civil Service Commission provide services outlined in Chapter 341A to Mills County on a temporary basis while it is in the process of re-establishing its own Commission.

WHEREAS Pottawattamie County is willing to provide such services to Mills County on a temporary basis until it is able to re-establish its own Civil Service Commission or until June 1, 2015, whichever is sooner.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Pottawattamie County, Iowa agrees to share the services of its Civil Service Commission with Mills County on a temporary basis as set out above and shall have all the powers and duties as set out in Chapter 341A.

NOW BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the counties this Agreement shall be subject to the following conditions:

1. This is a temporary arrangement and does not establish a permanent combined civil service system for Pottawattamie County and Mills County.
2. The term of this arrangement shall continue only until such time as Mills County has re-established its own Civil Service Commission or until June 1, 2015, whichever is sooner.
3. The Pottawattamie County Civil Service Commission shall have all the powers and duties of a combined civil service system while exercising its powers and duties on behalf of Mills County.
4. The Mills County Auditor shall be designated as the Personnel Director for Mills County civil service commission records.

This resolution is mutually agreed upon by the Boards of Supervisors of Pottawattamie County, Iowa and Mills County, Iowa by adoption of said Resolution on the dates so signed.

Motion carried on a roll call vote: Mayberry – Aye, Crouch – Aye, Kohn – Absent

Danelle Bruce, Mills CPC Supervisor explained that Rolling Hills Case Management was no longer serving Fremont County beginning July 1, 2015. Since Mills County will no longer receive funding from Fremont County, the Case Manager Supervisor will receive a decrease in salary and FICA and IPERS for the 2015/2016 budget.

Motion by Mayberry seconded by Crouch to approve the decrease effective with the 2015/2016 budget year.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes: 2 Nays: 0

Bruce updated the Board on the proposed RFP the Governor is sending for managed care services. The counties may not be required to provide Case Management services.

County Attorney Tricia McSorley was present on behalf of Jill McAleer to request a contribution from Mills County in the amount of \$125 to go towards Engaging Communities and Empowering Victims annual luncheon.

Pottawattamie County currently donates \$4000 and the other 4th Judicial Districts will be asked to contribute as well.

Motion by Mayberry seconded by Crouch to approve the \$125 contribution from Mills County for the Engaging Communities and Empowering Victims annual luncheon.

Motion carried on a vote: Ayes – 2, Nays – 0

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, they adjourned to meet on Tuesday, February 24, 2015.
