Glenwood Archeological State Preserve/Foothills Park

The Glenwood Archaeological State Preserve is Iowa's 96th dedicated preserve. There are 107 recorded archaeological sites on the property which covers 906 acres. It is open to the public as a low impact recreation area, meaning no activity can impair the integrity of the site. The site offers paved trails that are ready for running, hiking, biking and wildlife observation. Along the lower paved trail you will find the June Parks Bluebird Trail. Aside from the archaeological significance of the property, one can also find forest, oak savanna, native prairie, restored prairie, and agricultural grounds. This is an excellent site for bird watching.

While the area is open to public recreation it is NOT open to types of recreation that may create erosion issues, such as ATV or EQUESTRIAN USE.

This park is open to non-consumptive recreational use. It is illegal to remove, injure, destroy, or deface any natural or man-made structures or materials, including trees, flowers or wildlife except with written permission of the Mills County Conservation Board. Mushrooms, fruits and nuts can be harvested for personal use.

Please read over these basic rules for the park:

- **No motorized vehicles beyond the parking area**
- **No hunting or trapping**
- **No firearms**
- **No camping**
- **No open fires**
- **No fireworks**
- **Pets must remain on a leash at all times**
