

Election Day Registration

To register to vote on Election Day, you must:

- provide proof of **Identity** (photo ID)
- provide proof of **Residency** (your current address in the precinct)
- **Sign an oath** (attesting that the information you give is true)

Acceptable Forms of Identification

Proof of Identity (must include a photo and cannot be expired)

- **Iowa driver's license or non-driver ID card**
- **Out-of-state driver's license or non-driver ID card**
- **United States passport**
- **United States military ID or Veteran's ID**
- **Identification card from an employer**
- **Student ID issued by Iowa high school or college**
- **Tribal ID Card/Document (must be signed, with photo, not expired)**

Voters must also provide proof of residence if proof of identity does not contain voter's current address.

Proof of Residence (must include name and current address and be current within 45 days; may be in an electronic format or on paper)

- **Residential lease**
- **Utility bill, including cell phone bill**
- **Paycheck**
- **Property tax statement**
- **Bank statement**
- **Government check**
- **Other government issued document**

Voters With No Identification

Voters with no identification may establish identity and residence in the precinct by written oath of a person who is registered to vote in the precinct. The attester MUST show ID.

Voter Registration Fraud

A person commits the crime of Election Misconduct in the First Degree if the person submits false information when registering to vote. Election misconduct in the first degree is a class "D" felony, and punishable by a fine of up to \$10,245 and/or imprisonment of up to five (5) years.
